Sharon Katz & The Peace Train have been working with Promotora de las Bellas Artes to train singers on both sides of the California/Mexico border. On July 21st, Singers & Supporters from throughout California will meet in San Diego and travel across the border to meet up with the Mexican singers for a Unity Concert at the gorgeous performing arts center in Tijuana, CECUT. Here are the details:

9:00 AM: All Singers & Supporters from California side meet at World Beat Cultural Center in Balboa Park, 2100 Park Blvd for final rehearsal and to get their "Transcending Barriers" T-shirt.

Pack your own lunch and beverage.

10:00 AM: Sing as we Parade from World Beat Cultural Center to the San Diego Trolley at City College Station, 12th Avenue & C St.

Take the Trolley to San Ysidro Station and eat the lunch you packed.

Those with Passports - or if under 16 years of age with Birth Certificate & Parent - will then Walk Across the Border. (If you don't have the documents/ability to cross the border, you can still cheer us on as we go and then return to your own home.)

12:00 Noon: Once across the border, we'll be met by the singers and supporters from Promotora de las Bellas Artes and the Marshalls from the City of Tijuana who will escort us as we Sing & Parade for approximately 20 minutes to Centro Cultural Tijuana (CECUT).

1:00 - 4:00 PM: Friendship-building workshops and rehearsal at CECUT. (Families and supporters will be able to tour the exhibits at CECUT while the singers rehearse.)

4:00 PM: Meal is provided for all participants at CECUT. Then we'll make final preparations for the concert.

6:00 - 7:00 PM: FREE PUBLIC CONCERT ON THE ESPLANADA OF CECUT

7:30 PM: After saying goodbye to our new friends in Mexico, we will be transported in chartered busses back across the border & then directly to our starting point at World Beat Cultural Center.
